
# Onatti Theatre visits for students of French, German and Spanish

# German visits to Warwick University and the Goethe Institut

Last half term our KS3 Germanists were fortunate to have two opportunities to engage with German outside the classroom. First up was a day trip to the University of Warwick for a German immersion day. Our Year 8 students engaged in a range of activities based on the *Karneval*, (whilst dressed as compound nouns – *natürlich!*) and we were delighted that they were crowned winners of competition at the end of the day! Our second outing was down to the Goethe Institut in London. Students took part in a language workshop about graffiti and the Berlin Wall, carried out an information hunt in the stunning library and watched a film in the Institut's very own cinema!



# "Francophonie On The Road"

Students in Year 7 and Year 8 had an inspiring Francophonie immersion day thanks to the 'Francophonie on the Road' roadshow which rolled into Solihull in March. Students of French from Tudor Grange Academy Solihull and Highfields School, Wolverhampton, took part in a range of diverse workshops: a short film screening; Olympic-themed activities to preview the Paris Olympics and Paralympics in summer 2024; and modelling clay gargoyles following a historic trip back in time with the aid of VR headsets to the construction of Notre Dame Cathedral. The headsets also gave students a glimpse of the era of the French Revolution and the chance to cruise over Paris in a hot air balloon.

The workshops were organised by the Institut français in a bid to promote the French language and Francophone cultures of the world. The event took place on the week of the Journée Internationale de la Francophonie – as part of a series of school visits the length and breadth of England.



### A visit from NCLE

Grand Union Language Hub welcomed Caroline Conlon from NCLE, where Tudor Grange Academy Solihull showcased its MFL department. Caroline Conlon observed lessons in different Key Stages in French, Spanish and German. A panel of students recounted their own experiences of language learning to her, articulating some of their favourite learning methods and how they might use languages in the future.
